

Menara Palma, Jakarta, Indonesia

This distinctive 'A'-shaped building is part of the scenery enjoyed by the traffic on the busy Kuningan Avenue in the Golden Triangle, Jakarta's central business district. Designed in the internationally renowned architectural studios of Denton Corker Marshall, Menara Palma has been described as a monument to the future.

This 29-storey tower was built by PT BAM Decorient Indonesia. The contract also included the construction of an adjacent car park building.

Scope of work

Phase one of the project comprised the finance, design and construction of a 900-metre block wall including fill and pavement construction.

Phase two comprised the refurbishment of the existing quay wall including berthing facilities and installation of 550 metres of crane rails and six ship-to-shore crane parking stations. Part of the scope was the construction of a new marine dock block wall on an underwater concrete foundation, including a workshop and a fuel tank station. BAM International also provided utilities such as a fresh water line, fire hydrants, electrical and provisional ducts, and light masts.
